Alex Montegriffo

Devizes and District Foodbank joined a Trussell Trust scheme in June to research local causes of financial hardship, and to work with communities and organisations to campaign for change so that no-one needs to use a food bank. The community organiser in this scheme, Alex Montegriffo, has submitted evidence to a cross-party group of MPs on responses to destitution, started setting up free school uniform swap shops, and is involved in discussions with Wiltshire Council to ensure their support schemes get money directly to people's pockets.

We provide emergency food to people in crisis. Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. In 2022 we fed over 2,500 people of which over 900 were children. We received over 30 tonnes of donated food and other items during the year, and whilst we are grateful for all donations, we do ask that vou ensure that the food items have a minimum of 4 months until the best before date and that you check our website and Facebook page for our most needed items.
